Interested Students are invited to apply for an internship position to earn tuition-reducing scholarships and obtain work experience, further improving their CV.

Internships are available during the semesters before the program, and can be completed at the student's home / campus, without geographic restrictions. Alternatively, there is also an opportunity to do it during our upcoming programs on site.

# Types of projects T.I.C.L.S. 5G interns might work on:

Working online from home / campus, students that join T.I.C.L.S. on an internship program may be involved on a variety of projects. Promoting the programs at your school and recruiting others to join our remarkable team will add to your personal self-esteem but also make available extra scholarship credit. Some options include:

Social Media Marketing: Before, during and after an upcoming program, interns help T.I.C.L.S. to
create and share content on our various platforms: Facebook, Twitter, blog, Instagram, and more.
Interns help by developing and implementing new and creative campaigns, share results of these
activities with our team members and engage in continuous learning in a variety of subjects, such as
writing and designing skills.



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- Program Planning: Interns help out on a variety of projects as we prepare for our upcoming
  programs, including content and recruitment material creation, assistance in developing membership
  recruitment material, meeting with other applicants or even business associates in their area, raising
  funds, and more.
- 3. **Program Operations:** During the program, students work on a variety of tasks, including logistics and entertainment. Students typically work 1-2 hours per day, although some days may be longer than others. There will be meetings with professors and staff, and the interns are expected to be proactive, engaging and friendly.

## Scholarships for study abroad with T.I.C.L.S.:

Completing their internship, remotely connecting with our team through online tools, students may earn tuition reduction scholarships that can be used on any upcoming T.I.C.L.S. program:

- a. 15 week internship (120 hours minimum) 1000 € scholarship
- b. 30 week internship (240 hours minimum) 2000 € scholarship
- c. Option of working on site, 1-2 hours per day during the program 300 € scholarship

Home: 8-10 hours per week (approx),

On site: 1-2 hours per day (approx), 2-3 weeks

## Qualifications and Enrollment Requirements:

- 1. Interested in public relations, social media or related field. Major of studies is not defined.
- 2. Computer proficiency including Microsoft Word, Excel and Outlook
- 3. Strong knowledge of social media channels (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, wiki)
- 4. Excellent written and verbal communication skills of the English language
- 5. Ability to measure and document the impact of social media and suggest action steps to increase it.
- 6. Applicants must have a 2.6 GPA, and have completed one year of undergraduate studies.
- 7. Applicants must fill out the internship application (to be emailed upon interest).
- 8. Applicants must schedule a Skype interview with T.I.C.L.S. staff.
- 9. Award of the Internship Certificate, and associated scholarship, will be related to the work time sheet that will be submitted to TICLS, monthly, and of course the quality of the work produced.
- 10. In order to receive the scholarship associated with the Internship, students must follow the T.I.C.L.S. online application procedure and be accepted to an upcoming program.



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11. Upon admission, students must pay the enrollment fee to the relevant T.I.C.L.S. program, which cannot be redeemed with the scholarship amount.
