Polykarpos Th. Adamidis

LLB, LLM, PhD, General Director of National Defence Policy and International Relations

Dr Polykarpos Adamidis graduated with the distinction of Valedictorian from the Aristotelian University Law School in 1993. A National Foundation Scholar, he completed in 1995 a Master's of Laws degree (LLM) at the Harvard Law School, Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Following his military service as a reserve officer of the Hellenic Army Ordinance Corps, he served from 1999 to 2003 as a research assistant at the Commercial Law Department, Aristotelian University, where he received his PhD, his thesis entitled "*Mergers and Acquisitions in the Banking sector, under the Application of EU Competition Law*". From 2009 to 2013 he taught at the Democritus University of Thrace, Department of Business Administration (Legal Practice on Institutional Issues).

He was admitted to the Bar in Athens in 1996 and is licensed before the Supreme Court. His extensive professional background includes legal counseling to European Agencies, Ministries and regional authorities, among them:

She has taught at the Open University of Cyprus in Athens (Master's degree in "Communication and Journalism"/"Society and Communication/ Journalism" module), at the Technological Educational Institute of Ionian Islands in Kefalonia island (Bachelor's degree in "Public Relations and Communication"/module leader of "Political Communication") and at the University of Wolverhampton, West Midlands- U.K. & College of Professional Journalism, Athens for both Bachelor's degree in "Broadcast Journalism" (module leader of "Further Independent Study, Practical Project", "Digital Journalism") & Master's degree in "Contemporary Media" (module leader of "Contemporary Media: Industry & Practice", "News Production. Theory & Practice").

Despina has a wide and varied media practice experience (presenter, producer, correspondent, editor, researcher, public relations, interview taking) in Great Britain and in Greece (BBC, CNN, LGR, Economist magazine, ANT1, LGR, Channel M, Institute of Port Development, Tourism Market

magazine) and has also worked at the Ministry of Education, LongLife learning and Religious Affairs as a special advisor at the Press Office and Public Relations.

She has participated in a number of seminars and speeches (Cyprus Problem, European affairs, Media, local/regional authorities' issues, journalism, translation-interpreting) and been a member of the UK National Union of Journalists (NUJ). She is the founder and president of the Northern Attica Union of Constantinopolitans & Minor Asians and has been awarded by Cherie Blair for sponsoring a programme on the rehabilitation of inmates at London Wandsworth Prison, as a project assistant for RFD. She is currently an Executive Councillor of Eastern Attica-Athens- Press Office Representative and recently re-elected for a second term.

Dr. Dusan Batakovic

Former Ambassador, Director, Institute for Balkan Studies, Serbian Academy of Arts and Science

Batakovic graduated with a degree in history from the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Belgrade in 1982. He holds an M.A. in history from the same institution (1988). He received his Ph.D. in history from the University of Paris IV: Paris-Sorbonne in 1997 with the thesis *La France et la formation de la démocratie parlementaire en Serbie 1830-1914* (France and the formation of parliamentary democracy in Serbia, 1830-1914).

He is a specialist for nineteenth- and twentieth-century Balkan history. He has written and published extensively on the modern and contemporary history of Serbia, in particular Kosovo and Serbian-Albanian relations, focusing on nationalism, and the origins of religious and ethnic strife. Another area of his research is the impact of communism on the contemporary history of Serbia, Yugoslavia and the Balkans. Batakovic writes in Serbian, English and French and his bibliography includes dozens of historical monographs, edited volumes and more than a hundred articles published in various languages.

Batakovic is also the author of the historical TV documentary *Crveno doba* (The Red Epoch), which aired on Serbia's public broadcaster, RTS, in 2004. Combining testimonies of witnesses with historic narrative the film was the first to open the question of the crimes of the communist Yugoslav authorities (the "red terror") against their political and class enemies in post-World War II Serbia and Montenegro (1944-1947). In October 2005 he became Director of the Institute for Balkan Studies of the Serbian Academy of Sciences and Arts and editor-in-chief of the Institute's annual *Balkanica* journal as well as of its Special editions. In September 2008, Batakovic was appointed Vice-Director of the Institute for Balkan Studies and elected president of the Serbian Committee of AIESEE (Association Internationale d'Etudes du Sud-Est Européen).

Parallel to his academic life, Dušan T. Batakovic has also pursued a career in politics and diplomacy. As the president of the Council for Democratic Changes in Serbia (a pro-democracy NGO), he campaigned against the Milosevic regime in the late 1990s. From 2001 to 2005 he served as Ambassador of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (later Serbia and Montenegro) to the Hellenic Republic. In July 2005 he became Advisor for political issues to the President of Serbia Boris Tadic. In that capacity he became a member, in November 2005, of the Serbian negotiating team at the UN-sponsored talks on the future status of the province of Kosovo in Vienna.

He was appointed Ambassador of Serbia to Canada in July 2007 and Ambassador of Serbia in Paris, France in January 2009.

Adriano Bosoni

Journalist, Europe Analyst at Stratford

Adriano Bosoni is a Europe analyst for Stratfor, where his work focuses on political, social and economic issues pertaining to the European Union. He holds a journalism degree from the Universidad del Salvador, Argentina, as well as a master's degree in international relations from the Università di Bologna, Italy. He is also a former Fulbright scholar. His current areas of expertise include politics, economics and social trends in Europe; EU history, institutions and policies; demographics and migratory movements; nationalist, far-right and anti-establishment political parties in Europe; and the culture and society of Mediterranean Europe.

Prof. Anthony E. Foscolos
Emeritus Professor, Technical University of Crete, Emeritus Research Scientist, Geological Survey of Canada

Born on 1930 in Cairo Egypt where I completed my elementary and high school studies. Subsequently, I pursued my education at the Aristotelian University, Bachelor in Agricultural Engineering followed by an M.Sc and PhD. at the University of California Berkeley in the field of Physical Chemistry of Clay Minerals. Upon completing my graduate studies in 1966, I was hired by the Geological Survey of Canada, Institute of Sedimentary and Petroleum Geology to carry research in the area of hydrocarbons in Central Alberta, Northeastern British Columbia, the Beaufort MacKenzie Delta and the Canadian Arctic Islands. One third of my scientific publications are related to these activities.

In 1986 I was elected as a professor at the Technical University of Crete, Department of Mineral Resources Engineering. My teaching was related to the field of Inorganic and Organic Geochemistry and Organic Petrology. Between 1966 and 1997 I also served as Academic vice President. 1988-1993, Head of the Department of Mineral Resources Engineering, 1995-1997, energy consultant for the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), 1975-1985 and Adjunct Professor, Department of Geography and Archaeology, University of Calgary, 1975-1986.

My scientific record includes 79 publications, most of them in peer review journals, with a Citation Index of 243 (till 2003), 33 participations at International and National Conferences with presentations and posters and 14 Technical Reports for the Public Petroleum Corporation of Greece (DEP-EKY), Public Power Corporation of Greece, S.A. (DEH), Institute of Mineral Exploration, Greece (IGME) and the United Nations.

Theodossis Georgiou
Chairman, Greek Association for Atlantic & European Cooperation
Co-Founder, The International Center for Leading Studies

Theodossis Georgiou is the Chairman of the Greek Association for Atlantic and European Cooperation. He is an honorary Lawyer after 40 years of practice at his own firm. Furthermore, he is the President of the Eurodefense – Greece, a Member of the Governing Council of AWEPA (The Netherlands), and its contact person in Greece.

Additionally, he is a Member of the Board of Regents of the Fund for American Studies (Washington D.C.) and Co-Chairman of the International Institute for Political and Economic Studies (IIPES, 1996-2012). From 2003 - 2012 he has served as a member of Board of the International Foundation for Election Systems, (UK Limited) Washington D.C.; London.

Having been involved in various networks of the Euro-Atlantic cooperation for more than 8 years, Th. Georgiou took the initiative to establish the Greek Association for Atlantic and European Cooperation, in 1991, and revive the principles of transatlantic links in Greece within the framework of Atlantic Treaty Association. GAAEC experienced a dynamic development and rapidly took a leading role among other NGOs in Greece and Europe, focusing on transatlantic cooperation, security and education. GAAEC works in close cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Defense of Greece, as well as with NATO Public Diplomacy Division.

On October 7, 1997, Mr. Georgiou was unanimously elected President of Atlantic Treaty Association (ATA; Paris; Brussels), an international organization (confederation) of the National Atlantic Councils and Committees of 42 States (all NATO and PfP countries) and remained in office until November 2000.

He has been Director of the Office for the Minister of Interior Affairs Kostis Stefanopoulos (1974-1976), Member of the Greek Delegation to the European Communities in Brussels (1976-1979 during the negotiations period of Greece integration), Secretary General of the Council of Economic and Social Policy (ECOSOC), and a Special Advisor of Prime Minister. He was also a Member of the Economic and Social Assembly (Committee) of the European Communities, a member of "Nea Demokratia" party in 1995, and a Founding Member of the "Democratic Renewal Party" until its cessation at the election of Kostis Stefanopoulos as the President of the Hellenic Republic. He has run in national elections in Athens and Patras electoral districts, as well as in elections for the European Parliament.

Mr. Georgiou has been a guest lecturer in various academic institutions and universities in Europe,

Caucasus, Canada, the US and Africa and continues being active. His academic interests and research focus primarily, from the political point of view, on transatlantic security and cooperation, Euro - Atlantic integration, role of NGOs in the 21st century, dialogue between North and South, resolution of conflicts and conflict prevention. During the last 25 years Mr. Georgiou has been organizing and has chaired hundreds of symposiums, conferences and round table discussions both in Greece and around the globe, and he has delivered a vast number of speeches. Additionally, he has led and participated in countless international meetings, representing governmental and non - governmental sectors.

Having a strong involvement in the field of interdisciplinary education, in 2012 Mr. Georgiou, together with other distinguished personalities, founded The International Center for Leading Studies (TICLS), a new platform compounding various educational programs.

On June 4, 2003, he was awarded the “Chevalier dans l’ Ordre de la Legion D’ Honneur” by the President Jacques Chirac and on November 26, 2004 he received the “Golden Laurel Branch Award” from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bulgaria. He also has several other decorations and distinctions given in recognition of his support for the integration of South-Eastern European countries to NATO and the EU. Mr. Georgiou studied Law in the University of Athens, European Law at the “Université Libre de Bruxelles” in Belgium and International Law at the Academy for International Law in The Hague, Netherlands. He is married to Alik Mitsakos and has one son.

Dr. Panos Livadas
Secretary General, National Tourism Organization of Greece

Panos Livadas graduated from Athens College and obtained his Bachelor degree in Business Administration and Political Science at Hofstra University, New York, and at the University of Florida, Florida. He completed his postgraduate studies at the University of Athens (Master in 1996 and Ph.D. in 2007) on “Electoral Behavior.”

From 1987 to 2004 he worked as a technocrat in the private sector. In March 2004, Panos Livadas was appointed Secretary General of Information of Greece’s Ministry of State and later Secretary General of Information of Greece’s Ministry of Interior. During the 2004 Athens Olympics, Mr. Livadas was director of the Zappeion Olympic Press Center. Among other duties he has reorganized the Press and Communication offices of Greece abroad. Panos Livadas has also worked on issues related to the promotion of Greece in China, energy deals with Russia, Bulgaria, Italy and the global communication campaign for the inauguration of the New Acropolis Museum. He is married and has 3 children.

Barbora Maronkova
Program Officer, Engagement Section, Public Diplomacy Division, NATO HQ

Ms. Maronkova graduated at the University of Economics, Bratislava, Slovak Republic at the Faculty of International Relations in 2002. She established and headed a Slovak based NGO Centre for European and North Atlantic Affairs to contribute to a public and academic debate on Slovakia’s membership to EU and NATO from March 2003-February 2006. Since 2003 to 2005 she was actively involved with the Euro-Atlantic Security Study Group, PfP Consortium of Defence Academies and Security Studies Institutes, Garmish-Partnenkirchen, Germany.

Since September 2006, she works with the Public Diplomacy Division of NATO HQ in Brussels, Belgium - she started as a programme coordinator to raise awareness and public information about NATO and its policies and was promoted to programme manager in September 2010. Dr. Alik Mitsakos, M.D., Ph. D.
Co-Founder & Dean, The International Center for Leading Studies
Chairperson, Education and Science Committee, Greek Association for Atlantic and European Cooperation

Alik Mitsakos studied Medicine in Belgium, San Diego, the U.S.A., and the University of Athens, Greece, subsequently specializing in Anaesthesia - Intensive Care and Pain Management. She holds a Ph.D., cum laude, in Pharmacology.

She has worked at all levels and eventually Director of Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Unit keeping simultaneously a Private Practice, in Greece and abroad, including Stanford University in California and other Centers in the U.S.A.; London, England; Moscow, Russia; and Cape Town, South Africa. She has taught at the University of Athens, the Institute of Vocational Training, and at many international advanced programs.

She has been actively involved in promoting the academic and clinical advance of medicine and the welfare of anesthesiologists. Has served on the Board of the Hellenic Society of Anaesthesiologists, founded the related Association that set the standards of the specialty, has served as the National Delegate at the Monospecialist Committee for Anaesthesia and Reanimation of the European Union (U.E.M.S.), on the European Board of Anaesthesiology, as well as numerous Hellenic and International Societies, including the European Academy and the European Society of Anaesthesiology.

Besides her professional career, she has also been an active member of Civil Society with a particular focus on Youth and Women, on issues related to International Relations, Security, and Education, for the past 25 years and more. She has been active in Soroptimist International, served as President of the Union of Greece, served as President of the Parents Federation of the Arsakeion Schools of Greece, is founding member and Secretary General of the Greek Association for Atlantic & European Cooperation, and president of Women In International Security - Hellas. She has also served on the Board of Advisors of the International Institute for Political & Economic Studies of the Fund for American Studies and Georgetown University.

She has created a unique International Educational summer program for teenagers (aged 15 – 18 years of age) the “Kernels of our Future”, based on non formal / informal education methods, (pilot in 2004), on issues of affecting the broader responsible civil society building and public spirit. The International Center for Leading Studies was founded through G.A.A.E.C. in 2012, and she serves as Dean.

She has participated in over 100 major Conferences and meetings all over the world, including the U.N. initiative on the question of Palestine, is member (founding member in most) to a number of women international networks, has delivered numerous addresses, and published many articles to scientific journals and the press on her related interests. Her recent publications relate to the experience acquired on the current concepts in the learning approach and processes, as well as those of soft diplomacy.

Dr. Georgios Panos
Senior Lecturer, Stirling Management School, University of Stirling

Dr. Panos is currently a Senior Lecturer in Economics at the University of Stirling. Beginning September 2014, he will be a Reader in Finance at the Adam Smith Business School of the University of Glasgow. He was previously a lecturer at the University of Stirling and at the University of Essex. He has served as a consultant to the World Bank in multiple occasions (in five occasions for a total of some seven years, working on the finance and private sector development unit and the poverty assessment unit) and has been affiliated with EU-funded projects (on work and well being, health at work, and socioeconomic inequalities of the older workforce). He is also the director of the MSc in Banking & Finance at the Stirling Management School.

His expertise includes areas of intersection between labour and financial economics. His research has been featured in outlets such as the Journal of Financial Economics, the Journal of Banking and Finance, the Industrial Relations: A Journal of Economy and Society, inter alia. Jan Versteeg was appointed Her Majesty the Queen's Ambassador to the Hellenic Republic in summer 2012. He presented his credentials to President Papoulias on 13 September 2012. He was

Deputy Permanent Representative of the Netherlands to NATO from 2009 until 2011. From 2004 to 2009 he was Diplomatic Advisor (EU affairs, International Economic issues) to Prime Minister Balkenende. Before that he served as a counsellor, Head of the commercial and EU section of the Netherlands Embassy in Madrid, he worked in the European Integration Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and in the Permanent Representation of the Netherlands to NATO and WEU as a policy officer and spokesperson. He studied Economic Geography and Spanish at Amsterdam University from 1982 to 1988. Mr Versteeg was born 18 July 1964 in Tilburg, the Netherlands. He is married to Bärbel Geijssen and they have three children. He has a passion for sports (windsurfing, snowboarding, sailing, running, football) and reading (history, modern literature, arts).

Dr. Dimitris Xenakis
University of Crete

Dimitris K. Xenakis was born in Heraklion Crete. He studied International and European Politics (BA, MA, PhD) and his doctoral thesis *Transforming Regional Orders: The Helsinki and the Barcelona Processes Compared* (University of Exeter, 2000) was awarded with the European Studies Prize (2002) by the Hellenic University Association for European Studies. Since March 2003 he teaches International Relations as Adjunct Lecturer in the Department of Political Science at the University of Crete, in which he was unanimously elected as Lecturer in International Politics in October 2006 and Assistant Professor in 2012. He has also taught at the National School of Public Administration (2003-4), the Department of International and European Studies at Athens Panteion University (2005-6), the Department of Mediterranean Studies at the Aegean University (2006-7), and the Program of Business Administration (2009-2010), Greek Open University. Since 2010 he teaches in the Program in European Cultural Studies, Greek Open University and the National Security Academy. Since 2009 he was appointed Director of the Euro-Mediterranean Policy Unit in the Hellenic Center for European Studies (Foreign Ministry), and in Vice-Chairman of the Center for Security Studies (Ministry of Citizen Protection) as well as, member of the Scientific Board at the Defence Analyses Institute (Ministry of National Defence). In the past he has served, among other, as Research Fellow and Head of the Mediterranean and Middle East Studies Unit (2007-9) at the Athens based Institute of International Economic Relations; Advisor at the Hellenic Parliament (2004-7); International Relations and Organizations Expert at the General Secretariat for Financial Planning and Defence Investment of the Hellenic Ministry of Defence (2003-4); Strategic Analyst at the Defence Analysis Institute (2002-3), and Research Fellow at the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (2001-2). He has participated in numerous international academic conferences and policy seminars, as well as, in summits and informal meetings of the Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership and the European Unions's Defence Ministerial Meetings, as well as in the workings of the European Affairs and Foreign and Defence Policy Committee's of the Hellenic Parliament. He has contributed in international research projects and he is member in various research networks and groups, as well as, referee and/or member of the Editorial Board in various international and Greek academic journals. His publications have been appreciated with more than 200 references in major international editions, while some of them are used as basic textbooks in undergraduate and post-graduate programmes in Greece and abroad.
